



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


#### **APPLICATIONS BY SECTOR, TYPE OF INVESTMENT AND REGIONS:**

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



- Based on conducted controls during 2021 it can be concluded that one of the major problem is the period of processing of applications and project approval (verification of offers, changes of projects, incomplete applications, supplement and technical corrections, overlapping of calls and work-load per employee, quality of business plan); the period far exceed the timeline set in the procedures (9 months); recommendations: further recruitment of staff in the Department for Project Approval, simplification of working processes and procedures, changes of legal framework...

  - submitted by NAO to EC on 21 April 2021





#### **Forecast of Likely Payment Requests 2021-2022** 2022



## Further activities planned to be taken in relation to the IPARD II implementation

- Monitoring findings and reporting to the DG AGRI on the state of play of implementation, in accordance with conditions stated in Amended Financial Agreement 2014-2020; First report with updated Action Plan sent on 01 October
- Further preparation of changes of legal framework and procedures in order to simplify working processes and increasing of absorption of funds, Working Group was formed at the end of 2020. At the end of the second quarter 2021, the draft amended Law on Agriculture and RD was submitted, which, among other issues, includes: blank/incomplete application form, advance payment (in accordance with the amendments of the Sectoral Agreement, advance payment was introduced, up to 50% of investment value, in addition to bank guarantees), requests for changes to the approved project (the party has the right to request a change to the approved project only once), definition of technical assistance, refund (default interest is introduced in case of return of incorrectly spent funds).
- Increased National Authorising Officer supervision related to the activities planed to be implemented in cooperation with all IPARD bodies
- Ensuring staff capacity in all IPARD Bodies, focusing on: further recruitment of staff in line with WLA, applying different tools and mechanisms for retaining staff and continuous training and improving institutional capacity

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

## **On-the-spot check**

- IPARD Agency strives to maintain the work processes and business continuity during the COVID 19
- •The work of the Sector for on-the spot check has been regulated through the mechanism of exceptional situations
- Pre-approval verification of applications for tractors wasn't performed during this period
- After normalization of the work process **289** on the spot verifications have been performed
- High intensity of the activity in March and April 2021 year **130** on the spot verifications
- •Controllers are constantly engaged in preparing, executing, and writing reports on completed verifications, even overtime

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## Payment approval

• A low number of submitted Payment requests due to difficulties in the realization of investments during the COVID 19 pandemic

• A high number of requests for the extension of the deadline for realization of the investment: 238 decision have been issued in total, 155 from the beginning of COVID 19

 Regular cooperation with Technical Bodies in order to speed up the processing of payment requests

• Due to the epidemiological situation, inspectors are unable to carry out the verifications, which has resulted in a large number of applications for TB control.

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

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## **Measure 1** – Investments in physical assets of agricultural holdings



Proposal to increase the minimum support intensity from EUR 5,000 to EUR 20,000



Proposal to introduce the Fishery sector (annual capacity 10t of fish)



Other crops sector: Proposal to equate the eligibility criteria for the procurement of tractors, machinery and mechanisation and construction of facilities (50 – 100 ha), i.e. 2-10 ha under hops Proposal to include seed processing centers as potential recipients of support



Meat sector: Proposal to increase the minimum capacity for: cattle 40, sows 40, sheep and goats 200, fattening pigs 300, broilers 5,000 and introduction of investments for turkeys (1,000-10,000) and geese (300-3,000)



Milk sector: Proposal to increase the minimum number of dairy cows from 20 to 50



# MEASURE 3 – Investments in physical assets concerning processing and marketing of agricultural and fishery products



Proposal to increase the minimum support intensity from EUR 10,000 to EUR 20,000



Proposal to introduce the Other Crops processing sector (investment value > EUR 50,000) and the Fish processing sector (maximum daily fish processing capacity >200 kg of fish)



Meat processing sector: Proposal to introduce turkeys and geese for slaughterhouses (daily capacity of 500 units) Processing facilities: minimum cutting or processing capacity of 500 kg per day at the end of the investment



Milk processing sector: unchanged – average daily capacity of 3,000-100,000 liters of milk at the end of the investment



Fruit and Vegetable processing sector: Proposal to divide the Fruit and Vegetable sector into Fruit sector and Vegetable sector and to define eligibility of recipients according to the investment value (> EUR 50,000), not according to the available area





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#### **MEASURE 4 – Agri-environment-climate and organic farming measure**

The aim of Measure 4 is to encourage agricultural practices that are beneficial to the environment and mitigate the negative effects of agriculture.

Operations under Measure 4 may also support the maintenance of biodiversity and genetic resources in agriculture.

The support is in the form of an annual payment per unit area or endangered head, as compensation for loss of income and additional costs, which are the result of adhering to special conditions that exceed the starting point and the usual agricultural practice (Baseline)

ORGANIC FARMING MEASURE will be supported through National Rural Development Programme and not through IPARD III Programme





#### **MEASURE 4 – Agri-environment-climate and organic farming measure**


#### Type of operations:

- Replacing chemical fertilisers with bio-fertilisers, green/animal manure in permanent crop land and/or arable land in line with a nutrient management plan;
- Banning the use of herbicides and replacement with mechanical removal of weeds in permanent crop land;
- > Application of inter-row cover crops and/or organic mulching in permanent crop land;
- > Establishment and maintenance of pollinator forage strips on arable land and gardens;
- Management of meadows, pastures through less intensive grazing, stocking density, resting during ecological sensitive periods;
- > Conservation of animal genetic resources for endangered sheep and horse breeds.



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## **MEASURE 6** - Investments in rural public infrastructure

The "Analysis of the capacity of local self-government units, challenges and opportunities for IPARD III Programme usage, as well as the current state of rural infrastructure" was conducted in 2020, with the support of the SCTM.

# PURPOSE OF ANALYSIS

**Obtaining guidelines for programming Measure 6 - Investments in rural public infrastructure** 

Consideration of specific infrastructural needs of rural areas in RS, but also the challenges of local self-government units in the projects implementation

Consideration of the competencies and capacities of local selfgovernment units for the infrastructure projects implementation

Identification of problems (preconditions) that local self-government units must solve before realization

Survey was conducted on a sample of 84 local self-government units

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### **MEASURE 7 – Farm diversification and business development**



#### **Rural tourism**

- construction and equipping of categorized accommodation facilities (e.g. rural touristic household and handicraft, tourist camps, small hotels...)
  - construction and equipping of secondary facilities for providing rural tourism services (infrastructure)



**Direct marketing of agricultural - food products and homemade products** (clothing, cosmetics and hygiene products, art objects, etc.; construction and equipping of facilities for storage and sale: on the farm, in local shops, markets, restaurants, online...)



#### Small-scale services for local people and tourists

construction and equipping of facilities for providing services (e.g. repair of agricultural and forestry tools, machinery and mechanisation, motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles; repair of computers and communication equipment, hairdressing/cosmetic services...)

Investments in the renewable energy sources shall be eligible as an integrated part of a project in these sectors (solar panels in rural tourism or other sector etc.).

### **MEASURE 7 - Farm diversification and business development**

SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Supported investments have to be implemented in settlements which are located in rural areas;
- Maximum capacity in the number of beds in registered accommodation establishments is limited to up to 30 single beds, per a recipient.

INTENSITY OF SUPPORT

- Up to **60%** % of the total eligible expenditures of the investment;
- Maximum **70%** for investments:
  - ✓ of young farmers;
  - ✓ of producers of certified organic products.
- 80% for an investment related to waste water treatment and waste management, usage of energy from renewable sources and investments in circular economy.

- improving the capacity of local entities supporting the implementation of the IPARD Programme (e.g. local self-government units);
- strengthening the national administration managing the IPARD Programme (top-ups).

Preparation, reduction of the administrative burden for recipients or streamlining of implementation of measures in the programme to ensure their effectiveness, including pilot projects for those measures where entrustment/implementation is foreseen at a later stage


