# JUSTIFICATION FOR THE MODIFICATION OF THE LIST OF ELIGIBLE EXPANDITURES

## CONSULTATIVE PROCESSES

August 2017 - LEE was presented along with the proposal for the First Modification of the IPARD Programme for comments, suggestions, etc.. to the members of the MC during the video conference of the IPARD Monitoring Committee

May-October 2017 - necessity for technical changes - clarification of the terminology used (in relation to translation of LEE from Eng) noted in the process of drafting the Rulebooks for M1 and M3

December 2017 – April 2018 - Following the announcement of the first IPARD calls, potential users and associations suggested that certain investments listed in the LEE need further clarification

March – April 2018 - Consultations with professors of the Faculty of Agriculture were carried out regarding the proposed modifications

# LEE MODIFICATION PROCEDURE

March 2018 - MA drafted the proposal for LEE modification based on all the comments submitted by that time



March – April 2018 – Regular consultations with IPARD Agency carried out



March – April 2018 – On going consultations with the European Commission



30 May - Official approval obtained by IA



31 May – LEE sent to DG AGRI for approval/adoption



June 2018 - After obtaining the LEE approval/adoption by DG AGRI, the next step is modification of the Rulebooks for M1 and M3

# SUBSTANTIAL LEE MODIFICATION

## New investments:

- Eligible construction works: construction of firefighting reservoirs and installing of hydrant network (in all sectors of M1 and M3);
- Includes all forms of renewable energy (in all sectors of M1 and M3);
- Investments in purchase of equipment and construction of facilities for keeping of the heavy type breeding flocks (sector meat M1);
- In addition to greenhouses (glass and plastic tunnels), other facilities included for the production and storage of fruits and vegetables (M1);
- Facilities for machinery and equipment storage (in the sector of fruits and vegetables and other crops sector – such as already present in the milk and meat sector ;
- Fruits and vegetables sector: sprayers, fogging machines, sprinklers; machines for sterilization of soil, vegetable diggers, vegetable harvesters, belt conveyors for vegetable harvesting, machines for fruit harvesting including fruit shakers and mobile platforms for harvesting of fruits and vegetables;
- Equipment for detection of metal and/or other physical risks (milk sector M3)
- Investments in technologies that contribute to energy efficiency and environmental protection (meat, fruit and vegetables sector in M3)

## Entrustment of IPARD preparations and current situation (1)

**During 2017 intensive preparations of IPARD bodies were conducted:**

- **IPARD Working Group** was established by the Government with the task to conduct all necessary preparatory activities for successful finalization of IPARD entrustment process
- **Comprehensive Action Plan** for addressing of all audit findings was developed and monitored regularly by IPARD WG
- By July 2017 almost all envisaged activities from the Action Plan were implemented allowing start of external audit
- **Second external audit** was conducted in the period August-September 2017

*„The purpose of the audit was to perform an assessment with regards to IPARD II, in order to provide reasonable assurance whether NAO SO, NF, IPARD Operating Structure (Managing Authority and IPARD Agency) comply with the applicable requirements for re-submitting the revised documentation to the EC (DG AGRI) for entrustment with budget implementation tasks for IPARD II and also to evaluate if the findings of previous audits has been addressed in an appropriate way.“*

## Entrustment of IPARD preparations and current situation (2)

- Consolidation of **IPARD entrustment package** (revised in accordance with all provided audit findings)
- **Updated request for entrustment with budget implementation tasks under IPARD II** was submitted to EC (DG AGRI) on **16 of October 2017** for the following measures:
  - M1** – Investments in physical assets of agricultural holdings;
  - M3** – Investments in physical assets concerning processing and marketing of agricultural and fishery products.

## Entrustment of IPARD preparations and current situation (3)

- **DG AGRI audit mission** – end of November 2017
- **Additional external audit re. price reference database** was requested and performed – December 2017
- **Final DG AGRI audit report** was communicated in February 2018

*„The authorities in Serbia have satisfactorily addressed the main issues already communicated and that the structures and procedures set up for IPARD II fulfil the minimum conditions referred in Framework Agreement and Sectoral Agreement. However some recommendations of intermediate importance already communicated are reiterated and further ones are identified during DG AGRI audit mission. Implementation of additional measures for these findings was needed.“*

## Entrustment of IPARD preparations and current situation (4)

- Activities for addressing remaining audit findings undertaken by all IPARD bodies and status on their implementation communicated to DG AGRI – end of May 2018
- Decision on IPARD entrustment by EC / **Financing Agreement** was signed

## Entrustment of IPARD next steps

- IPARD Working Group will continue to work
- Action plan for entrustment of other IPARD measures will be prepared and implemented:
  - M7** – Farm diversification and business development
  - M9** – Technical assistance
- Monitoring and supervision of the internal control system and implementation of IPARD II Programme (measures 1 and 3)

## STEPS TAKEN

During 2017. year we worked on addressing the audit findings, especially the blocking ones, in order to be granted with the entrustment of EU budget implementation tasks . We particularly worked on:

- finalizing the legal base for the implementation of IPARD Programme
- providing new premises for the DAP in accordance with ISO 27001 and ISO 27002
- cooperation with Technical bodies
- recruitment for vacancies
- developing the Reference Price Database (verification of the reasonableness of the costs)

Reports from the external and DG AGRI audit, carried out in the second half of 2017. year, showed that all blocking findings from previous audit missions were closed. As regards the Reference Price Database there were no other findings. Supervision of the reference prices was conducted through an additional external audit.





## RESULTS ACHIEVED

- On 26. February 2018. The European Commission's Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development (DG AGRI) officially confirmed that the Republic of Serbia has met all the requirements necessary for free implementation of the IPARD II Programme.
- The procedure for signing the Financing Agreement with the European Commission has been commenced; after which funds from the IPARD fund will be paid to the first eligible beneficiaries in the Republic of Serbia.





## IMPLEMENTATION OF IPARD PUBLIC CALLS

Three IPARD Public Calls have been launched so far:

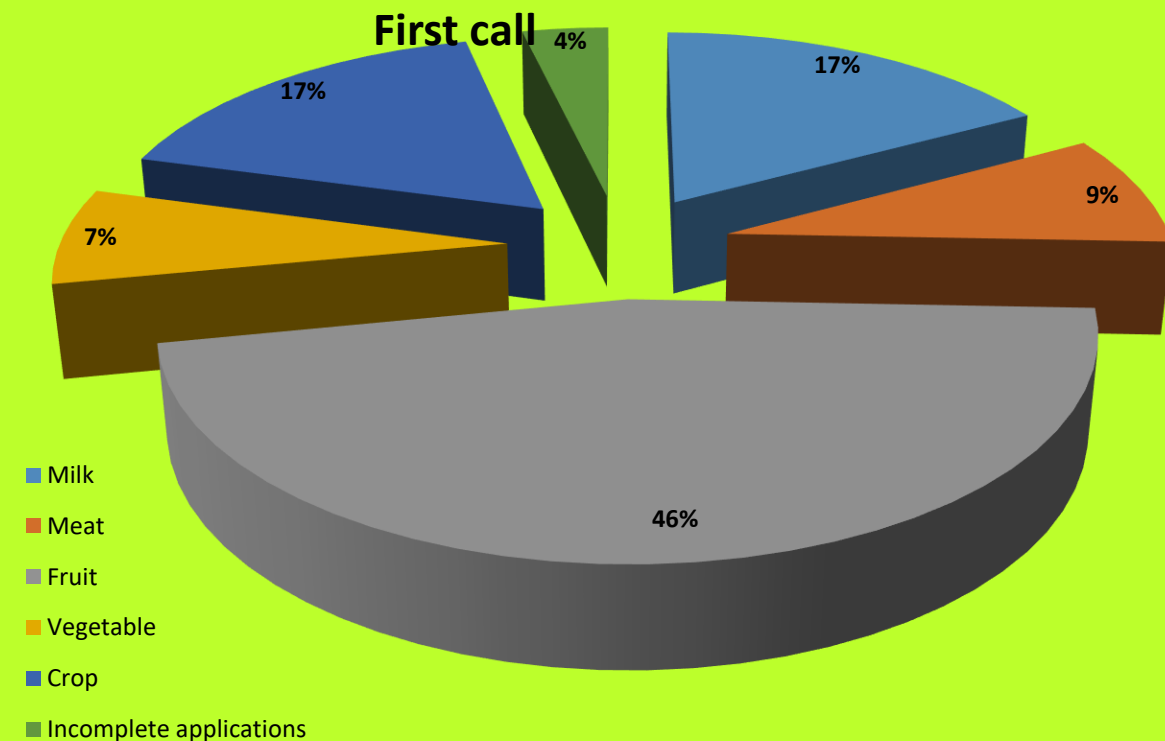
- The First Public Call for submitting Applications for Project Approval for IPARD subsidies for the investments in physical assets of agricultural holdings for the purchase of new equipment and mechanization (Measure 1):
  - ✓ from **25. 12. 2017.** year to **26.02.2018.** year.
  - ✓ 82 Applications received
  - ✓ allocated funds: around **8,37** million Euros
- The Second Public Call for submitting Applications for Project Approval for IPARD subsidies for the investments in physical assets of agricultural holdings for the purchase of new tractors (Measure 1):
  - ✓ from **04. 01. 2017.** year to **26.02.2018.** year.
  - ✓ 396 Applications received
  - ✓ allocated funds: around **4,65** million Euros



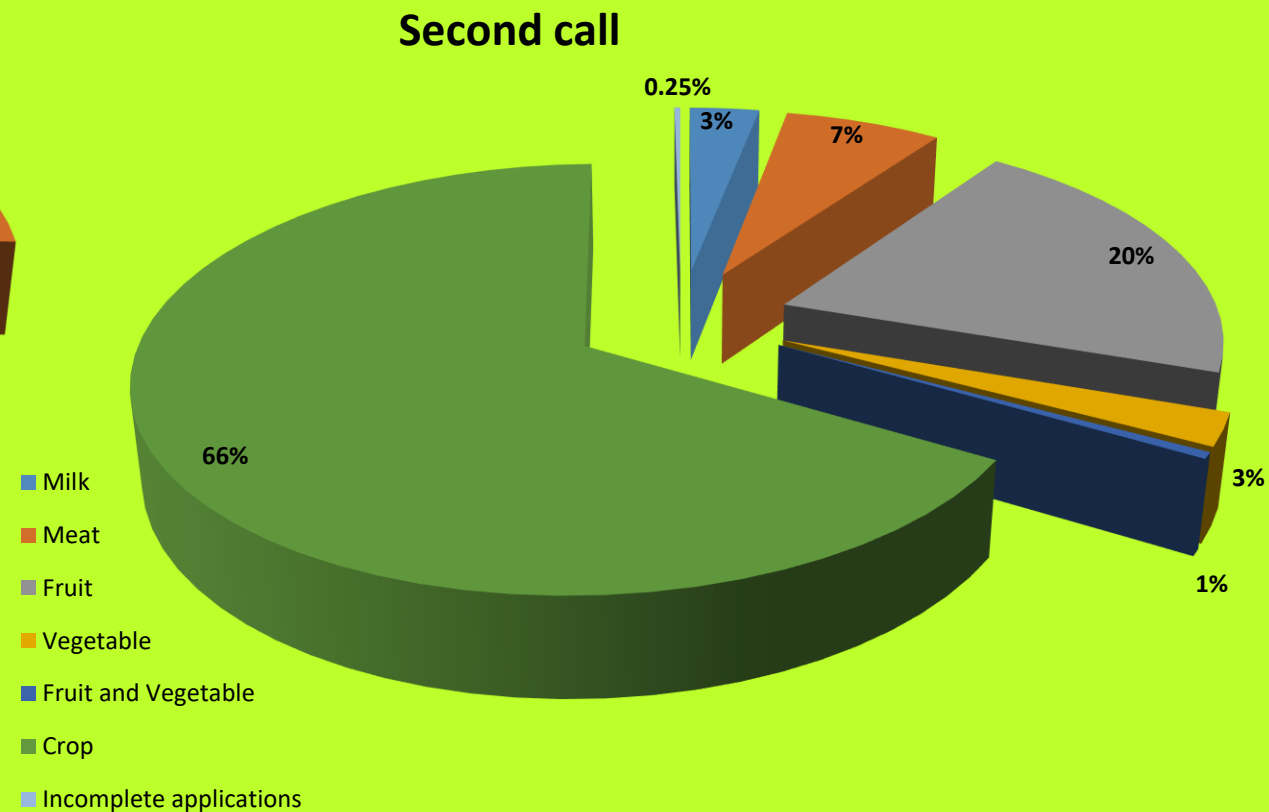


# STRUCTURE OF RECEIVED APPLICATIONS

## Structure of received applications per sector

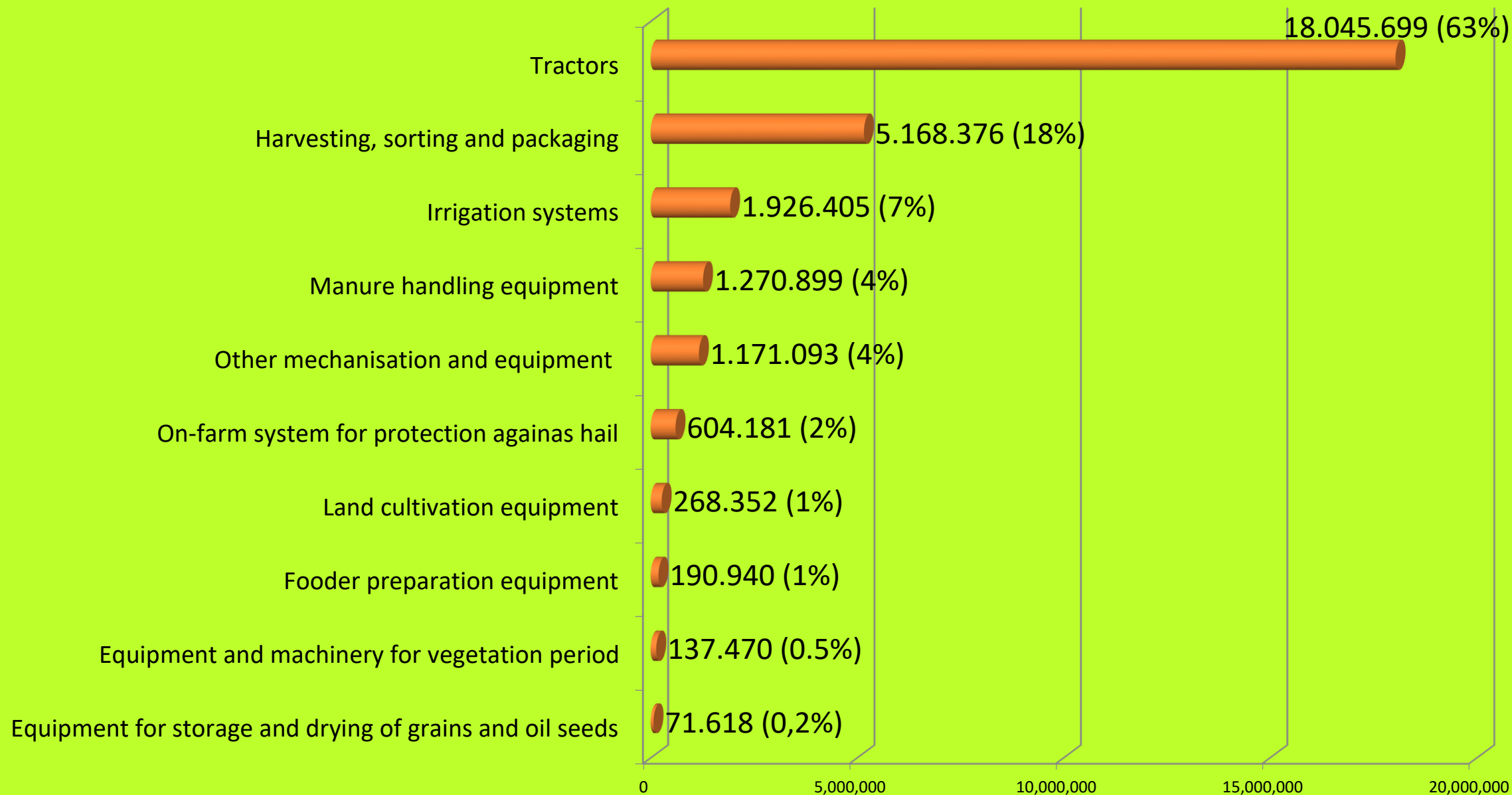

- Lectures have been organized for Agricultural Advisory Services and consultants by the Managing Authority (MA); respective employees from the IPARD Agency took part in the lectures.

The support aims primarily to the type of documentation needed to the IPARD beneficiary.

# Eligible investments for the published calls (December 2017.-may 2018.) - Subsidies for the investments in physical assets of agricultural holdings

## The first call:

### Measure 1: Investments in physical assets of agricultural holdings

## ANALYSIS OF THE BUDGET FOR THE FIRST AND THE SECOND CALL

Audit of DG AGRI November 2017.      December-revision of the Price Reference data base  
the first public call 26. December 2017.

Only eligible investments in the First call where the ones with price in the Price Reference data base.

A short period of time to complete the implementation of the Plan of promotion and preparation of applications

### Limited number of prepared beneficiaries

Beneficiaries are waiting the fourth and the fifth call in which they will be able to invest in facilities and equipment both





# Structure submitted requests by sectors

## Measures 1-the First call

- In the period prior to the first call, in the Price reference data base was assessed the largest share of the prices for equipment, machinery and mechanization in the sector of fruits and vegetables;
- In the meat and milk sector eligible investments were in the machinery for solid manure handling, animal feed preparation, as well as vehicles for transport in the milk sector;
- It's easier to achieve standards for fruits and vegetables producers (they don't own cattle);
- Producers who are engaged in intensive fruit production have invested in equipment for harvesting, sorting and storage, to improve already existing production and reduce handling costs.
- Problems associated with legalizing objects- meat and milk sectors;
- Problems obtaining permits for construction- meat and milk sectors ;
- Sector for fruits and vegetables has big investment potential.





# Structure submitted requests by sectors- Measure 1 (Second call)

- A greater number of requests for tractors, compared to the budgeted amount of funds is expected,... due to obsolescence of machinery (tractors).
- In 2017. for the producers of fruit and vegetables where approved 1470 requires for purchase of tractors through national measures (44% is required from Šumadija; 37% of Vojvodina; 13% Eastern Serbia, 5% Belgrade);
- Other crops sector is not sustained by the national measures for the purchase of tractors;
- Producers of fruits, which have a higher intensity of production, had a need for the procurement of tractors with greater power;
- Smaller producers have obtained new tractors through national measures;
- From 2018. year national measures do not fund purchase of tractors.



## STRUCTURE OF SUBMITTED REQUESTS BY TYPE OF USER

**In the total number of requests submitted for both calls, natural persons - individual farmers, have a dominant share (92%), while legal entities-companies participate only from 7%.**

**Viewed by calls, physical persons make a significant participation in the Second Call (96%) compared to the First Call (73%).**

**From the point of view of the total number of submitted requests, legal entities - companies have shown increased interest in the procurement of new equipment, machinery and machinery (26%) in relation to the purchase of tractors(3%).**

**It is expected that legal entities in the subsequent calls to compete in a larger extent than natural persons for investments in the construction of facilities and the procurement of equipment.**



# REGIONAL REPRESENTATION OF THE USERS-SUBMITTED REQUESTS

Regarding regional level, in terms of Measure 1, the Vojvodina region has the largest share, both in the number of requests submitted and the amount of costs.

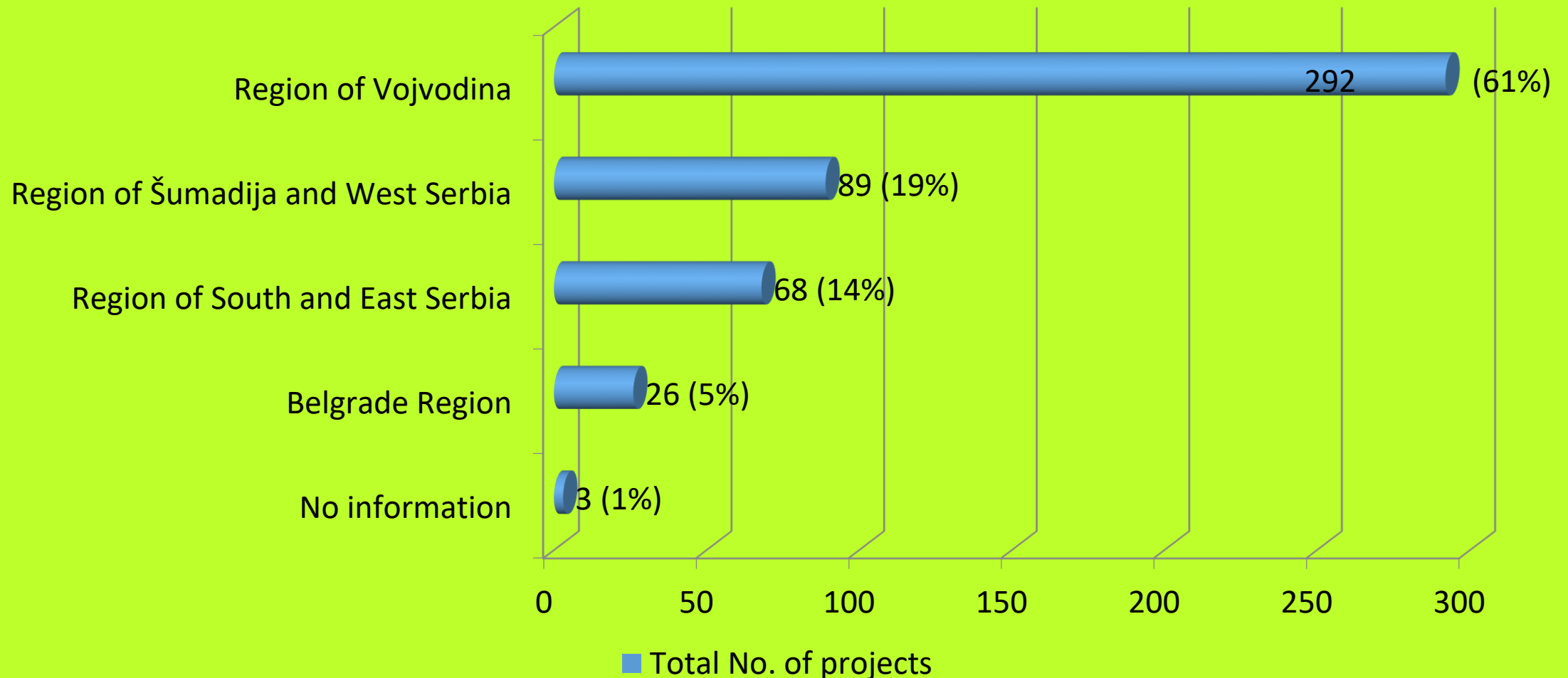
The share of Vojvodina in the total number of submitted requests for Measure 1 amounts 61%-

Significantly lower participation in the total number of submitted requests was made in:

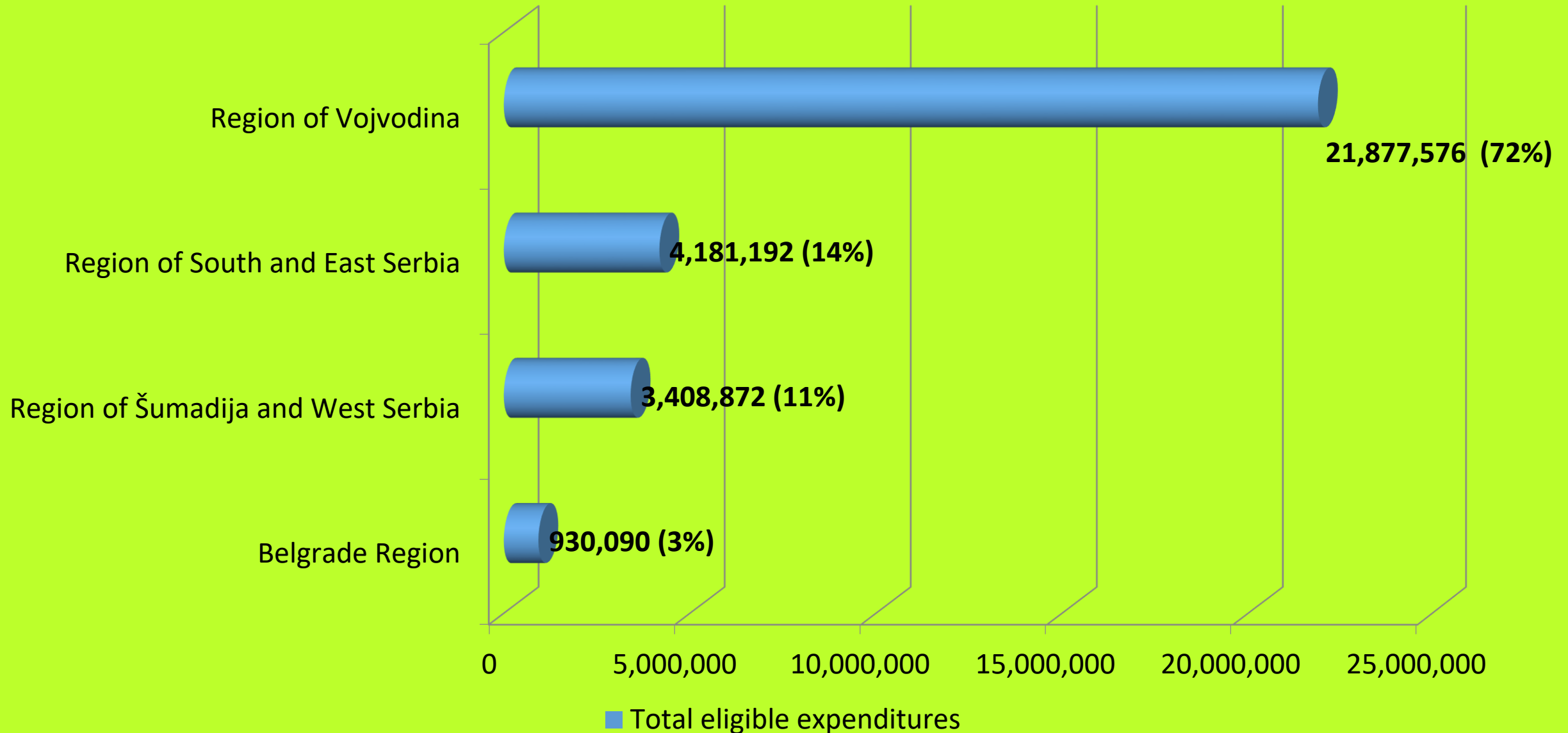
- the region of Sumadija and Western Serbia 19%,
- the region of South and East Serbia - 14%,
- Belgrade region -5%.

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# Short food supply chain and added value – opportunities for small farms and IPARD support in Serbia

## Short food supply chain

- Short food supply chains involve **very few intermediaries**. In many cases produce only travels a short distance, so producer and consumer can actually talk to each other...
- Such supply chains typically involve **local producers working together** to promote local food markets. These partnerships help boost the rural economy, creating new ways of selling local produce and attracting new types of customer. They also foster cooperation between local farms, the tourist industry and the food sector.



## Why?

- Because IPARD criticised for not reaching small farmers in the Western Balkans and Turkey (mostly due to their poor financial viability);
- Because a large part of the agri-food sector in the region are small and very small farms, which cannot be ignored by policy;
- Because small farms are searching for viable options for income or complementary income.



## Why?

- Farmers can obtain a higher share in the added value by **doing more than primary production** – they can take a share in the margins if processing or distributing to final consumer;
- Farmers can **exploit extra value** coming from niche products (brands, special features of territory), geographical location (access to urban markets) or tourism or other more innovative ideas in order to compete with standard (strong) food chains.
- This requires **cooperation** and **strategy**
- This option is **not** for everybody

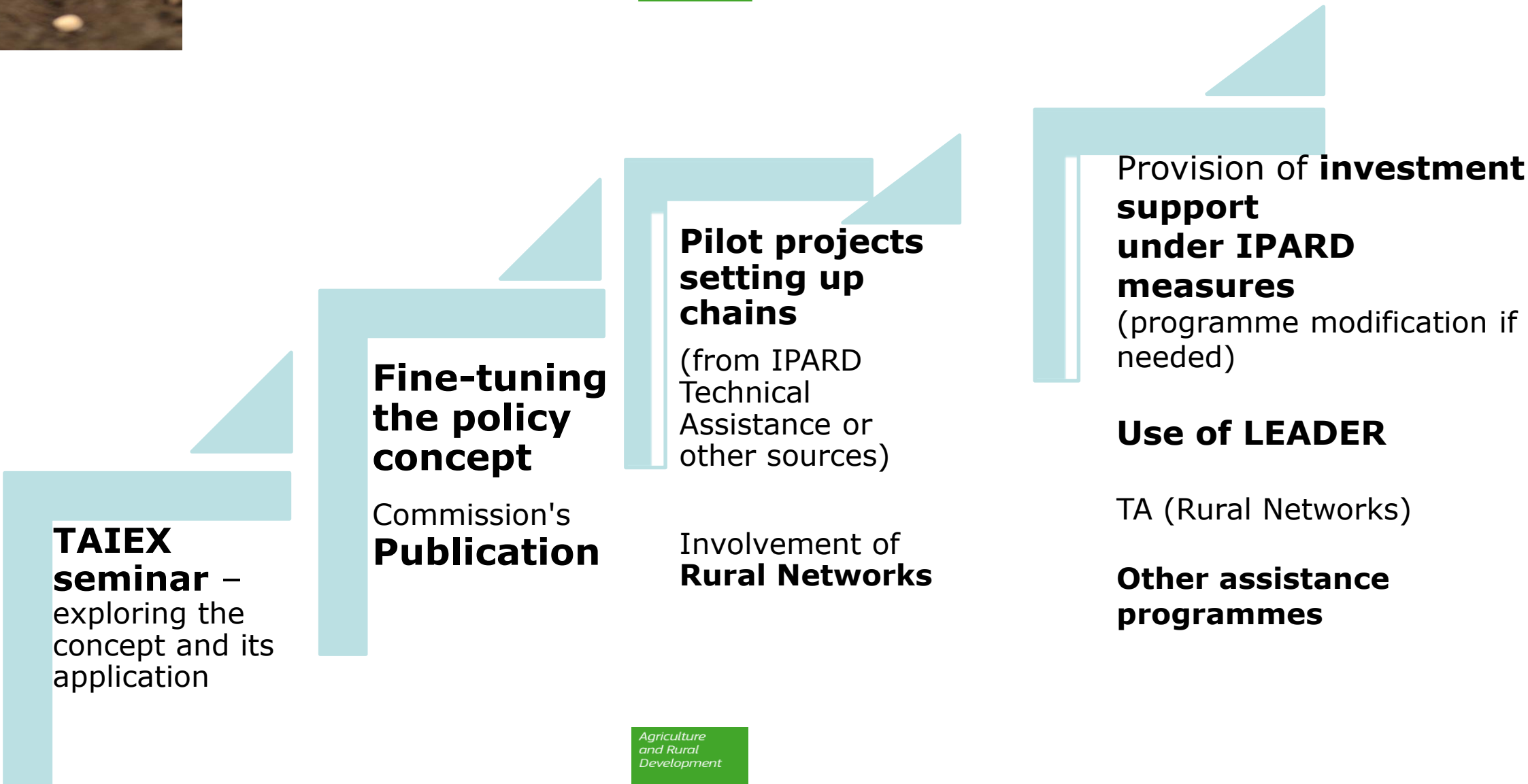


## Example from Serbia





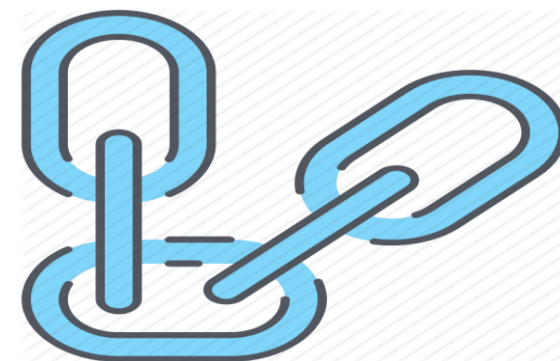
- We are looking for **viable** opportunities from IPARD to support such **cooperation** and thus reach (small) farms (and rural businesses)
- Potentially high added value of IPARD: multiple beneficiaries, multipliers but also visibility for urban consumers – contribution to rural development
- Cooperation in short food supply chain considered as a **possible future flagship initiative for IPARD**





## Process of building the chain

- Wider partnership
- Animation and trust building
- Training
- Marketing, technical, economic, legal expertise
- Leadership
- Time





## Some conclusions

- *The Western Balkans and Turkey boast a **richness of (traditional) local products** and culinary traditions, which could be better **valorised to the benefit of producers.***
- *The **concept** – very **relevant** to the region and it now needs to be explained and **highlighted as a valid flagship initiative by DG AGRI to policy makers in the region** and wider administrations in these countries.*
- *The countries are encouraged to **set up some pilot projects** in SFSC using "soft" support – TA or other sources*



## Some conclusions

- **IPARD programmes will be screen** in this respect ,as to how **SFSC** might be implemented
- It is a time consuming process – many existing major **obstacles** at the level of farm production (hygiene and food quality standards), cooperation (unwillingness and lack of capacity to act together), distribution (road transport), etc.
- Important role of **National Rural Development Networks and existing LAGs** (identification of good projects, training and publicity activities, or developing and/or implementing pilot projects )



# IPARD (or equivalent) role

- Relevant IPARD investment measure(s) (on farm investments, diversification, food processing)
  - Eligibility conditions – will they be met?
  - Selection criteria – how to give most incentives?
  - Aid intensity?
  - Integrated projects?
- Technical assistance – training – publicity
- LEADER
- National Networks – examples – knowledge – guidance
- Complementary sources of funding (IPA I, bilateral aid)
- Special arrangements for IPARD III?

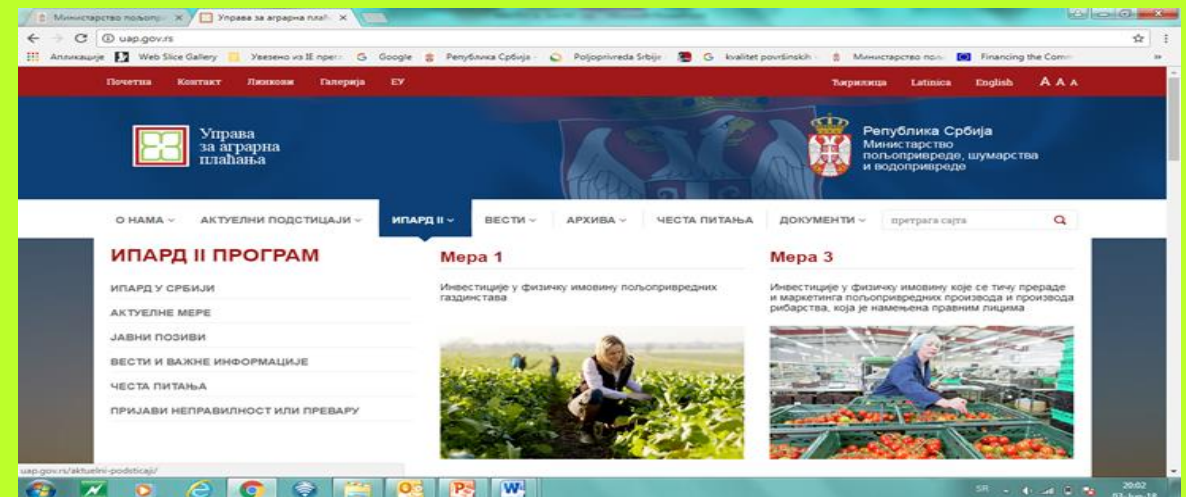

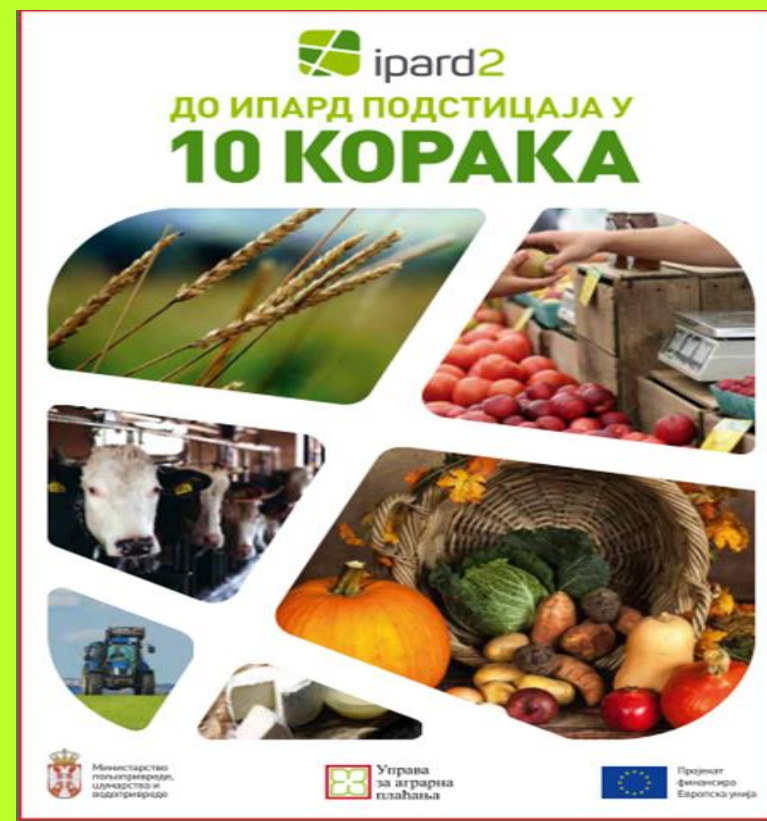
